## AS LAST YEAR IT IS WITH GREAT REGRET THAT WE CAN ONLY POST SNOWDROPS TO ADDRESSES IN ENGLAND, SCOTLAND AND WALES. DAFFODILS CAN ALSO BE SENT TO THE USA.

Our summer list, as many of you have noticed, is a little late this year. This is because big things are happening here at Dryad, including some amazing things on the Snowdrop front (more later)!

Many of you are already aware that there is no team of workers here at the nursery – just a little elderly lady in her back garden (me) plus a very kind friend who is a marketing genius and gives me his time and expertise for free.

As such, the task of keeping all the nursery stock going, along with all the admin involved, is getting too much to manage - not to mention the upkeep of half an acre of garden.

A decision has had to be made to keep the business at a manageable level, and after much thought the main result is that we will be running down our stocks of current cultivars of non-Dryad snowdrops as they reach flowering size over the next 2 or 3 years.

Our own named varieties will continue to be available as long as we have stocks, but the existing varieties will not be propagated further. **The Dryad Golds will become legacy varieties, along with the existing Myths and Legends group.** This will give time and space to assessing and producing snowdrops from our other groups, including a 'Snow' series of true poculiforms, some very promising virescents, and soon (I hope) some of our yellow inverse poculiform range.

The intention is eventually to have only the daffodils and hepaticas here.

This year, we are passing our anemone collection over to our young friends Ben and Laura, starting their new nursery business at Cliff Bank Nursery, so there are no anemones in the list. As yet their business is in construction, so I will send you a link to their website when it is available, hopefully next year. We wish them every success.

Temporarily, there will be no crocuses/fritillarias either, to lessen the load this summer.

**Important to note** – we will no longer be offering snowdrops 'in the green' in January/February. They will only be available dormant in our summer lists. Only newly introduced cultivars will be offered through ebay at that time.

The result of all this, for you, is that there is a bumper crop of our Dryad speciality snowdrops available in our summer list this year – where possible our usual multi-nosed 'Clumps in Waiting'. Many will be the last of our stocks, and will not be available from us again. You will notice that they are available at very competitive prices in order to clear stock!

**For the first time, we are offering our named seedlings – Dryad Golds, and Myths and Legends inverse poculiforms – in our main list.** Also in the list will be our Estonian specialities – Spirit group and Bird doubles, and the popular German varieties.

There will be a limited number of only newly introduced varieties of snowdrops, and daffodils, on ebay over the next few weeks.

With all this, and over a hundred different miniature and species daffodils, I am expecting things to sell out extremely quickly so it will be even more important than usual to email in your orders as fast as you can once the list is released.

**PLEASE NOTE – MOST ITEMS ARE IN VERY LIMITED NUMBERS, SO PLEASE APPLY EARLY, LAST DATE FOR ORDERS JULY 31 2022. ALL ITEMS OFFERED SUBJECT TO SUCCESSFUL HARVEST.** As usual, we will also have a selection of our very special items on ebay for those not fast enough to order from the main list.

UK orders will be sent as soon as I can. Orders to outside the UK will all be sent together, after the ebay listings are finished, as they will all need to be inspected together by FERA before dispatch. All plants are flowering size, unless otherwise specified. Prices are PER BULB unless otherwise specified.

**POSTAGE AND PACKING – UK £6-50** per order. I am asking for less than the actual cost of delivery and packaging. If your order can be sent as Large Letter, I will refund any extra postage. Parcels will be sent by first class post, recorded delivery, so will need to be signed for. Orders can be collected from my home address if you are in the area.

**USA Shipping at cost plus £35 contribution to Phytosanitary certificate.** Customers in the USA may order narcissus **but not** snowdrops. As it now costs £30 for each Phytosanitary certificate, on top of the soil sampling costs and fees for the inspectors' visits, American customers may combine orders with a friend, but the shipping can only be insured for £250 maximum. I will not post until the ebay listings finish, in case you wish to bid on the narcissus listed.





## DRYAD GOLD SERIES

Raised here at Dryad Nursery, the renowned Dryad Gold Group snowdrops (with the parentage *plicatus* x *nivalis*, the hybrids fall under x *valentinei*) have strong stems which remain more or less erect, unlike 'Wendy's Gold', which dips its flower stems after flowering. They have been grown across the UK and in Europe and growers' feedback is that they are strong garden plants - robust, stable, increasing well and making a stunning statement, both for collectors and in the spring garden.

The ovary is shorter than Gold Sceptre and most of the rest of the group, and the pedicel longer. This has been one of my favourites since its first flowering.

Artemis was the goddess of chastity and the hunt, and the sleek shape of the plant and purity of the crisp markings of the flower is a tribute to those qualities, while the inner mark is reminiscent of an ancient Greek bow. **DRYAD DEMETER** has solid virescent characteristics, more oil paint than watercolour! Demeter is the Greek goddess of agriculture and vegetation (also known as Anesidora, sending gifts up from the earth). In the ancient Greek religion of Hellenismos she is associated with the colour green. I believe this snowdrop redefines the notion of virescent. The outer segments are prettily flanged at the edges, white with a solid emerald green mark reaching almost to the base, and with a notch at the apex. The inner segments are all green with a narrow white rim and narrow sinus. It is a short to mid-height snowdrop growing to about 16cm high under glass, probably shorter in the open. Leaves are short at flowering time, displaying the erect flower stems beautifully. The bulbs increase well.

Echo is a heavenly, statuesque and imposing snowdrop, easily recognised by a mysterious pale 'echo' spot above the dark green mark on the outers, and a corresponding pale mirroring of the dark inverted V on the inners. It is honey-scented, vigorous and increases well here.

Jupiter was the king of the gods in Roman mythology, and this name was chosen for our inverse poculiform because of its regal, upright bearing and crown-shaped outer mark.

Growing to about 25 cm under cover, the strong stems bear large flowers, held well above the leaves for maximum impact.

Each of the outer segments is broad and convex leading to a full, rounded outline to the flower, while the edge of the outers is tilted upwards to form a rim which reaches all the way around the perimeter except for the basal 'claw'. The texture is distinctly ridged, so that the outer mark, a rich green arc, extends along the furrows to produce the 'crown' which is a signature of this variety. There is a small sinus notch.

The inner segments feature a green X mark, of which the apical half is deep green, while the basal half is pale and diffuse, whereas the inner surfaces are almost entirely striped with green.

The plants increase well, forming large bulbs which flower consistently, and will make an imposing and majestic statement in the garden.

**DRYAD VENUS** has curvaceous, shapely flowers with a flirty frill around the outer segments on mature flowers. With such a ravishing, sensuous shape and markings the only fitting name was Venus, as the Goddess of Love and Beauty. It is a mid-height snowdrop growing to about 20cm high under glass, probably shorter in the open. To add to all this, not only is it scented, but it probably carries yellow genes having Wendy's Gold and Corrin as parents, so will be useful in breeding programmes for yellow poculiforms.





<p><b>ESTONIAN BIRD DOUBLE SNOWDROPS</b></p>		
<p>These new double varieties have the stamp of that great plantsman Taavi Tuulik who bred and developed the range in Estonia, along with the excellent Estonian Spirit range grown and introduced by Dryad Nursery. Taavi chose to name the series after Estonian birds. There are varieties with wonderful inner markings, quite distinct amongst the doubles and those with elongated inner petals like Berthille, which give them a petticoat appearance. We are proud to be able to release some of these stunning new varieties making a major addition to the double snowdrop varieties available to discerning collectors. Taavi's own notes on the group: <i>Galanthus Estonian Birds Group is created by Taavi Tuulik fom händ pollinated seeds using Galanthus nivalis 'Flore Pleno' as a male parent. The crossings were made in open garden 2007-2008 and were not fully controlled. Female parents were:</i> <i>G. plicatus from Crimea ('Kaur', 'Sõtkas', 'Vart')</i> <i>G. plicatus from Krasnodar region, Russia (with all-green inner segments) ('Kakk', 'Meltsas')</i> <i>G. elwesii var. elwesii from Turkey (Dutch export) ('Tihane', 'Tikk')</i> <i>G. elwesii var. elwesii from abandoned garden in Hiiumaa, must come from the NW Black Sea coast ('Lagle', 'Ristpart', 'Tutkas')</i> <i>Mixed plants G. elwesii and G. elwesii x nivalis – from abandoned garden in Hiiumaa, G. elwesii must come from the NW Black Sea coast ('Aul', 'Kiur', 'Luik', 'Sabatihane', 'Siisike', 'Vutt')</i> <i>From ca 200 bulbs during their first flowering 2012-2015 16 were with double flowers.</i></p>		
<p><b>G24</b> <b>Galanthus Estonian Bird Double Aul (Long-tailed Duck)</b></p> <p>£40 large double-nosed bulb</p> <p>5 available</p>	<p>AUL is a very pretty and distinctive double snowdrop flowering at 10-12 cm, with narrow leaves, and 3 outer segments surrounding a boss of inner segments which bear a two-toned double mark. The apical inverted V is a dark green, whereas the second segment, about half-way along the segment, is a more diffuse oval of pale apple green, sometimes separating into two 'eyes'. The 3 central inner segments are sometimes all white, extending beyond the rest of the inners. It increases well.</p>

Taavi tells me that the mother plant is <i>G. elwesii</i> from NW Black Sea Coast - never before used in breeding as far as he knows. It is one of his favourites.</p>	
<p><b>G30</b> <b>Galanthus Estonian Bird Double Tutkas (Ruff)</b></p> <p>£40 double-nosed bulb</p> <p>3 available</p>	<p>A very refined, compact double snowdrop starting to open at less than 10cm high. The stiffly upright, hooded, supervolute leaves present the flowers beautifully. At first, the very regular flowers will fool you into thinking it is a single snowdrop, as the inner segments are so neatly arranged inside. There are 3 outer segments and a very tight whorl of inner segments bearing a deep green inverted V at the apex, usually joined to a matching zone in the basal half, but not reaching as far as the base. The sturdy, almost cylindrical ovary is subtended by a curved spathe. This has become a nursery favourite.</p>



## ESTONIAN SPIRIT GROUP SNOWDROPS


The Estonian Spirit Group of snowdrops were discovered by renowned Estonian plantsman Taavi Tuulik in abandoned gardens and woods in Estonia and named as part of the Spirit family due to their pale, ghostly coloration and residual presence in abandoned or secluded areas.


As a group they are distinct by their generally compact stature, very pale leaves and ethereal colouring of ovary and inner mark – a very pale creamy yellow. A distinctive and outstanding diminutive form of *G. nivalis*, and a very different treasure for your collection.




Although appearing delicate, they are tough customers used to harsh Estonian winters.

As a group, it can be a challenge to get them to flower well. I have found they flower best on my raised sand bed where they will remain moist through the summer. You will receive mature, usually multi-nosed bulbs but I cannot guarantee they will flower next year.

<p><b>G32</b> <b>Galanthus Estonian Spirit Group Kullake</b></p> <p>£ 40 pack of 1+pup 10 available</p>	<p>The first named variety of the Estonian Spirit Group, and the smallest of the group found so far, usually flowering at only 5cm high. Green Crown flowers at about 12cm high, the flowers have green lines in the apical half of the outer segments, except for the tip, which are merged together with paler green shading. The inner segments have a white rim with a deep green apical mark extending to half the length of the segment. This continues in paler tones with deeper striations right to the base.</p>


