THIS YEAR DAFFODILS CAN ALSO BE SENT TO NORTHERN IRELAND, THE EU AND THE USA.

Once again, we will be sending ONLY Narcissi to Northern Ireland and the EU, as well as the USA this summer, thanks to assistance from our friends at Esker Farm daffodils.

The entire list is open to addresses in England Scotland and Wales, as last year.

This summer, we will continue to filter through our remaining stocks of non-Dryad cultivar snowdrops, along with remaining stocks of our existing Dryad cultivars as they become available.

There will be a limited number of newly introduced varieties of snowdrops and daffodils on ebay over the next few weeks, selling under my ebay account DRYADZNY.

I am expecting things to sell out extremely quickly so it will be even more important than usual to email in your orders as fast as you can once the list is released.

PLEASE NOTE – MOST ITEMS ARE IN VERY LIMITED NUMBERS, SO PLEASE APPLY EARLY
LAST DATE FOR EU AND NORTHERN IRELAND ORDERS JULY 14 2024.
LAST DATE FOR MAINLAND UK ORDERS JULY 28 2024

UK orders will be sent as soon as I can. Orders to NI and the EU will all be sent together, as soon as the paperwork is complete, as they will all need to be inspected together by FERA before dispatch.

Orders to the USA will also be sent together, after the end of the ebay listings, as usual.

Wherever possible, double-nosed bulbs of everything will be sent. All bulbs are flowering sized, unless specified otherwise.

Prices are PER BULB unless otherwise specified.

POSTAGE AND PACKING – UK AND NI £6-50 per order. I am asking for less than the actual cost of delivery and packaging. If your order can be sent as Large Letter, I will refund any extra postage. Parcels will be sent by first class post, tracked delivery, so will need to be signed for. Orders can be collected from my home address if you are in the area.

USA Shipping at cost plus £35 contribution to Phytosanitary certificate. Customers in the USA may order narcissus **but not** snowdrops. As it now costs £25 for each Phytosanitary certificate, on top of the soil sampling costs and fees for the inspectors' visits, American customers may combine orders with a friend, but the shipping can only be insured for £250 maximum. I will not post until the ebay listings finish, in case you wish to bid on the narcissus listed.

EU - £16.00 per order - customers may combine orders with a friend, but the shipping can only be insured for £250 maximum.

BD = bred by Brian Duncan NEW – new to list this year AW = bred by Anne Wright		
1+pup = one flowering size and one small bulb Asstd = assorted sized bulbs		
Hybrids – alphabetical list		
N1 Narcissus AMBRIAL £30 6 available	AW 12 Y-Y The first of our hybrids using pollen from the fabulous <i>Narcissus albimarginatus</i> , AMBRIAL is the child of <i>N. rupicola</i> subsp. <i>marvieri</i> × <i>N. albimarginatus</i> , and although it did not inherit the white corona rim, it does have the wonderful fragrance. The golden flowers, usually 1-2 per stem are slightly nodding, with an overlapping perianth, and small enough to be classed as miniature for exhibition. Flowering at about 20cm high under glass, with upright leaves, it makes a fine container specimen.	
N2 Narcissus Andy Blanchard £20 5 available	AW (<i>triandrus</i> x <i>cyclamineus</i>) Dainty and unusual 5Y-Y. Usually one flower per stem when it looks just like a creamy lemon form of <i>N. cyclamineus</i> . Larger bulbs may have twin flowers. Always in short supply and not the easiest one to grow. Many show prizes. Makes small bulbs.	
N3 Angel's Flight £20 3 available	BD (<i>cyclamineus</i> x <i>Candlepower</i>) 6 W-W Beautiful and graceful hybrid with elegant flowers of milky white with distinctly toothed flange at the mouth of the trumpet.	
N4 Narcissus Angelina £10 8 available	AW (AW 2759-2) (<i>Candlepower</i> x <i>cyclamineus</i>) 6 W-W Much admired creamy white reflexed flowers on 15cm stems.	









N5 Narcissus Aureolin pack of 1+pup £10 6 available	BD (<i>jonquilla x scaberulus x Camborne</i>) 7 Y-Y Small multi-headed daff with deepest golden flowers of excellent show form. One of Brian's favourites.	
N6 Narcissus Biondina £10 15 available	AW (Unnamed NZ hybrid x <i>Second Fiddle</i>) 1 W-W Charming small daff with slightly swept back perianth and expanded corona. 15-17cm high.	
N7 Narcissus BUNDLE pack of 1+pup £4 6 available	AW (<i>calicicola x watieri</i>) 7 Y-Y Charming multi headed flowers with 1-4 flowers per stem. Free flowering, growing to 18cm high.	
N8 Narcissus Callisto pack of 5 asstd £5 10 available	AW (Moon group) (<i>cantabricus petunioides x Atlas Gold</i>) 10 Y-Y AW 2762-3 Selected form with good solid, light yellow flowers, well flared.	
N9 Narcissus Cheeky Chappie £20 8 available	BD (<i>cyclamineus x Camborne</i>) 6 W-Y A real cheeky little daff with lemon yellow corona and short white reflexed perianth. This excellent show flower has won many prizes. Included in several Blanchard Trophy groups.	
N10 Narcissus CHIRP £8 6 available	BD (<i>N. asturiensis x Candlepower</i>) 1Y-Y Lovely clear yellow. Very smooth, very small, 14cm high. Very early. London winner in 2011 and 2013	
N11 Narcissus Chitter £8 6 available	BD 2 Y-Y (<i>Small Talk x rupicola</i>) An excellent show flower in the Division 2 class, in which there are not many really good varieties for exhibition. All yellow with a short cup and excellent perianth.	
N12 Narcissus Citron Baby pack of 1+pup £5 15 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola x Candlepower</i>) 2 Y-Y AW 2991-2-15 A favourite with visitors at our open day. 3.5cm wide fresh, pale lemon flowers on 15cm stems, Beautifully scented.	
N13 Narcissus Columba £8 10 available	AW (<i>N. cantabricus</i> subsp. <i>tananicus</i> open pollinated) 10 Y-Y The wide open flowers are a cool, very pale greenish lemon. Free flowering. Increases well.	
N14 Narcissus Coo £8 10 available <i>Daffodil Society Approved Miniature</i>	From Glenbrook Bulb Farm in Tasmania. Charming little hybrid growing to only 8cm in flower. Always in great demand. One bulb per customer - hopefully flowering size – it makes tiny bulbs.	








N15 Narcissus Craigton Chorister pack of 1+pup £5 8 available	10 W-W Bred by Ian Young, this is an exceptionally early hoop petticoat usually the first to flower here, in December.	
N16 Narcissus Crème Fraiche group pack of 1+pup £6 10 available	AW 3 Y-Y (<i>watieri x rupicola Spring Charm</i>) These seedlings are a favourite of mine, the pale lemon colour and compact habit, along with the delightful scent being common to the whole batch. Unselected seedlings, all similar and delightful. Flowers at 15cm high.	
N17 Narcissus Cyllene pack of 3 asstd £5 10 available	AW (<i>Narcissus cantabricus petunioides x romieuxii subsp albidus SF110</i>) Selected white hoop petticoat with beautifully pleated flowers of good substance.	
N18 Narcissus Daphnis pack of 1+pup £6 8 available	AW (<i>Narcissus romieuxii Julia Jane x bulbocodium praecox Moulay Brahim</i>) Selected hoop with very large wide yellow flowers.	
N19 Narcissus Doctor B £10 12 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola x jacetanus</i>) 2 Y-Y Named in honour of my husband's PhD, a very neat flower with a flared and lobed corona on 10cm stems.	
N20 Narcissus Dormouse £20 8 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola 'Spring Charm' x Second Fiddle</i>) 1 W-Y One of our tiniest hybrids, and a favourite with visitors. 26mm wide, pale greenish ivory flowers on 8cm stems. Beautiful violet-like scent.	
N21 Narcissus Elara pack of 5 asstd £5 10 available	AW (<i>N. cantabricus x romieuxii Atlas Gold</i>) 10 Y-Y One of our MOON group of hoop petticoats – butter yellow hoops with the rim reflexing as the flower matures. 15cm high, very early.	
N22 Narcissus ÉPONINE £40 3 available	BD (<i>cyclamineus selected x Candlepower</i>) 6 W-Y Rarely offered, flamboyant cyclamineus hybrid. Part of the winning Alec Gray Trophy group in 2016.	
N23 Narcissus Fat Rascal £5 10 available	AW 12 Y-Y (Selected clone from <i>obesus x triandrus</i>) One or two chubby lemon bells on short stems.	
N24 Narcissus Fling £15 10 available	BD (<i>cyclamineus x My Word</i>) Super 6 W-Y of excellent form in perfect proportion on short stems.	










N25 Narcissus Flurry pack of 1+2pups £10 6 available	AW (Candlepower x K/34/94) 1 W-W Elegant, soft white miniature with a long, prettily frilled corona and slightly swept-back perianth on short stems.	
N26 Narcissus Fresh Breeze pack of 1+pup £6 10 available	AW (AW 2661-1) (<i>watieri x cyclamineus</i>) 6 Y-Y Bright lemon, well reflexed flowers on short stems. 12cm high. The dainty flowers on short stems make it ideal for exhibition at daffodil shows or by alpine exhibitors	
N27 Narcissus Frisk pack of 1+pup £8 10 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola</i> x 'Fuco') although it looks to have N. cyclamineus in there somewhere. 12 Y-Y Flowering at 17-18 cm high, the perianth is lightly reflexed away from the cone-shaped corolla.	
N28 Narcissus Galantoquilla Group £15 6 available	BD BD (lagoi x assoanus) 12 Y-Y Exciting little hybrids from Brian, which he calls his snowdrop daffodils because they are similar in size, habit and flowering time to snowdrops. The similar seedlings are all about 20cm high. Likely to become a sought-after alternative to the very scarce Cedric Morris.	
N29 Narcissus Gale Force pack of 1+pup £8 10 available	AW (<i>rupicola x cyclamineus</i>) 6Y-Y One of Anne's favourites, 12cm high with deep gold flowers with a swept back perianth which makes the flower look like it is in the face of a strong wind! Sister to Whippet.	
N30 Narcissus Gianna £15 8 available	AW (Candlepower x Second Fiddle) 6 W-Y : Cute miniature with perky, swept-back perianth and prettily flared mouth to the corona. Opening W-Y, maturing to W-W. 10cm high.	
N31 Narcissus Giselle AM £12 20 available	AW 10 W-W A much-coveted self-sown hybrid, presumably between cantabricus and triandrus. Seems to be much easier to grow than other forms of the x <i>susannae</i> type (hope those are not famous last words!) Was awarded an Award of Merit at its first showing at an RHS show.	
N32 Narcissus GOLD BUNCH pack of 1+pup £15 5 available	AW (<i>N. triandrus</i> subsp. <i>pallidulus</i> x <i>N. fernandesii</i>) 5 Y-Y A x <i>incurvicervicus</i> cross. As the name suggests, the flowers are a glowing, intense deep yellow, and slightly taller than its sister Lemon Bunch. Both sisters are floriferous and increase well, flowering in April. They are both classed as miniature for exhibition.	










N33 Narcissus Gracie £15 5 available	AW 1 W-YWY (Candlepower x Lara Lovely) Graceful new miniature with elongated creamy white perianth and long narrow lemon corona with a faint 'halo' at the base of the perianth. As the flower matures, the corona becomes white, with a lemon rim and base.	
N34 Narcissus Iapetus £12 4 available	AW <i>N. cantabricus</i> subsp. <i>cantabricus</i> var. <i>petunioides</i> open pollinated selected clone 10 W-W One of our MOON series of hoop petticoats, IAPETUS has wide, pleated flowers which bring to mind Marilyn Monroe's famous flaring skirt! Very early flowering and richly scented, like the other MOONS it is best grown under glass where it can be given a dry, summer rest.	
N35 Narcissus Iolana £12 5 available	AW (<i>N. triandrus</i> x Second Fiddle) 5 Y-Y Distinctive new miniature with swept-back clear lemon perianth and straight corona which grades to almost white at the mouth. 12cm high.	
N36 Narcissus IVORY RIPPLE £15 3 available	AW (<i>N. triandrus</i> var <i>triandrus</i> and <i>N. cantabricus petunioides</i>) 12 W-W Ivory Ripple was awarded a PC in 2023. In colour it is a cool ivory, with the conical corona flared at the mouth and longitudinally rippled, hence the name. The 1-2 flowers per stem face outwards or slightly down on 20cm stems, above prostrate leaves. It will be excellent for alpine shows, but the fairly long perianth make it slightly too wide to be classed as miniatures for RHS daffodil exhibits.	
N37 Narcissus Jean Blanchard £12 10 available	AW ('Candlepower' x 'Snook') 1 Y-Y Named for a much-missed aunt. Flowering at 15 cm high, and holding its flowers in perfect proportion to the erect foliage. The golden yellow overlapping perianth is very slightly reflexed away from the deeper yellow corona. A fine exhibition flower.	
N38 Narcissus Kalyke pack of 1+pup £10 10 available	AW (Moon group) Selected from AW 2773 (<i>cantabricus petunioides</i> x <i>romieuxii albidus</i> SF110) 10 W-W Selected white hoop petticoat with smooth, glistening white flowers of good substance. The rim of the widely flared flowers is gently rolled back. Stamens and style exserted.	
N39 Narcissus KARI pack of 1+pup £8 6 available	AW (Moon group) AW 2762 -2 (<i>cantabricus petunioides</i> x <i>Atlas Gold</i>) 10 Y-Y Selected hoop with butter-yellow flowers. The rim of the widely flared flowers rolls back. Stamens and especially the style very exserted.	
N40 Narcissus KS/M/1/2007 £20 5 available	Another Keira Hybrid, a chunky little charmer opening 6W-Y maturing to 6W-W. Only 10cm high. Awarded Best Seedling Under Number RHS early Daffodil Competition 2018	










N41 Narcissus Lee Martin pack of 2+pup £3 12 available	Farrer Medal winning form of Narcissus obesus. Large golden hoops, above prostrate foliage.	
N42 Narcissus Lemon Breeze £5 10 available	AW (2661-B) 6 Y-Y Bright lemon, slightly reflexed flowers on short stems. 12cm high.	
N43 Narcissus LEMON BUNCH pack of 1+pup £15 8 available	AW 5 Y-Y (<i>N. triandrus x fernandesii</i>) At 25cm high, it is slightly shorter than her sister Gold Bunch, and as the names suggest, the colours distinguish them as well. Both are fragrant, floriferous and increase well, flowering in April. They are both classed as miniature for exhibition.	
N44 Narcissus Little CELINE £15 6 available	AW (<i>N. triandrus x rupicola</i> Spring Charm) 12 Y-Y As a companion to my daughter's namesake, 'Little Jen', comes another <i>x rupidulus</i> seedling named for her best friend. The two are similar in height and posture at 15cm high and nodding, but Little Celine's flowers are a reverse bicolor, with the corona paler than the perianth. As a flower for exhibition, her dainty flowers have already earned prizes for me.	
N45 Narcissus Little Dryad £15 5 available	AW (Candlepower x KB/M/1/98) 6 W-W Obviously my favourite, named for my nursery. Mature flowers are cool ivory, with strongly swept-back perianth and long straight corona with gently flared mouth. They are held on upright, 12 cm stems over low foliage.	
N46 Narcissus Little Finn £20 5 available	AW (6 W-W (Candlepower x <i>N. cyclamineus</i>) Opens W-Y, then matures to W-W. Almost a perfect 'Mitzy' in miniature, with a gently swept-back perianth and slightly flared corona. Only 10cm high.	
N47 Narcissus Little Frills £12 5 available	BD (<i>asturiensis x Camborne</i>) 1 W-W White miniature trumpet daff with a frilled corona. Grows to 14cm high under glass.	
N48 Narcissus LITTLE GOLDHEART £30 5 available	AW From 'Pequenita' x <i>N. rupicola</i> subsp. <i>watieri</i> , it is one of several excellent clones from the same seedpod, including many nursery favourites. Growing to about 18cm, the upright stems bear single flowers only 33mm wide, a creamy lemon in colour, but with the inside and rim of the short cup a glowing deep yellow. A real eyecatcher and excellent for exhibition.	










N49 Narcissus Little Jen £10 10 available	AW (<i>N. triandrus x rupicola</i> Spring Charm) 5 Y-Y At last a daffodil my daughter liked enough to bear her name! Dainty <i>x rupidulus</i> type with 1-3 pale, acid-lemon flowers on 15cm stems.	
N50 Narcissus Little Lemon £5 10 available	AW (<i>watieri x asturiensis</i>) 2 Y-Y 35mm wide, clear lemon, short-cupped flowers on short stems. 12cm high.	
N51 Narcissus LITTLE RACER £12 5 available	BD (<i>cyclamineus x Candlepower</i>) 6 W-Y Another winner from Brian. Miniature 6 W-W opening W-Y and fading to all white. Well reflexed perianth. Awarded a PC in 2013.	
N52 Narcissus LITTLE WHIZ £8 8 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola x cyclamineus</i>) 6 Y-Y Slightly taller and more robust than Gale Force, the broadly overlapping perianth and strong stems make this an ideal exhibition flower.	
N53 Narcissus Malinky £12 6 available	AW (Candlepower x Keira hybrid K/34/94) 2 Y-Y Daffodil judges will not approve of this little hybrid which has spider-like flowers of pale lemon only 4cm across on short stems. Name means 'skinny' in Ireland.	
N54 Narcissus MICA £40 4 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola subsp. watieri x Candlepower</i>) 2 W-W A stunning division 2 miniature, opening with a white perianth and pale lemon cup, maturing to a pure white overall. It has excellent exhibition form with an overlapping perianth that opens perfectly flat, and has won many prizes for me. At 16cm high, it also makes a wonderful container specimen.	
N55 Narcissus Minicycla £10 6 available	6 Y-Y (The genuine original clone obtained from Kath Dryden in 2005) This is the daff whose unavailability set me off breeding in the first place! 10cm high.	
N56 Narcissus Minionette £8 12 available	AW AW 2674 (<i>marvieri x cyclamineus</i>) 6Y-Y A long-standing favourite of mine with chubby yellow flowers with a short corona and perianth which is well reflexed. Named after the cute yellow characters from the film Despicable Me. 12 cm high. Awarded a PC and Best Bulb at AGS Loughborough Show 2020.	











N57 Narcissus Miss Poppy £20 10 available	AW (Candlepower' × Keira hybrid KB/M/1/98) 1 W-W Named after our baby granddaughter and (almost) as adorable. This little trumpet variety opens pale lemon and matures to white, often showing the whole range of colours in the pot. Only 12 cm high grown under glass (probably shorter outside) the upright stems proudly hold their perfect little daffodil flowers above the foliage. The trumpet is prettily flared at the mouth, and the petals overlap slightly to give a good exhibition form. Early flowering.	
N58 Narcissus Misty pack of 1+pup £15 8 available	AW (Snipe' × 'Candlepower') 6W-Y Similar to the cultivar 'Mitzi', but only 2/3 the size. Flowering at 17cm high, the flowers have a white perianth which gracefully curves backwards, and a long pale lemon corona, lightly frilled at the mouth. A quiet beauty.	
N59 Narcissus Pallene pack of 1+pup £12 10 available	AW (<i>N. N. romieuxii</i> × <i>N. cantabricus</i> var. <i>petunioides</i>) 10 W-W Flamboyant hoop petticoat with widely flaring, gently rolled back white flowers and protruding golden stamens. 15cm high, very early.	
N60 Narcissus Palomina £20 10 available	AW (Keira Hyb KB/M/16/02 x Candlepower) 6 W-Y Beautiful bicolour, white reflexed perianth and long bright lemon corona. Only 10cm high, it also has a strong perfume. The name comes from the fact that the image of several flowers reminded me of horses galloping towards the viewer (just me then?) and the horses just had to be the white and golden palominos.	
N61 Narcissus Pandia pack of 1+2pups £10 10 available	AW (<i>N. cantabricus</i> subsp. <i>cantabricus</i> var. <i>petunioides</i> open pollinated) 10 W-W One of the latest additions to our Moon series of hoop petticoats. Flowering at 15cm high, the flowers are petunioid in shape with a very flat corona and exerted stamens, rich lemony-cream when first open and becoming paler.	
N62 Narcissus Panna Cotta group pack of 1+pup £8 12 available	AW (<i>rupicola</i> Spring Charm x x <i>watieri</i>) 2 Y-Y Delightful clear pale lemon, scented, short-cupped hybrid with bluish foliage. Shorter growing than Crème Fraîche - 12cm in flower.	
N63 Narcissus Peach Twist £30 8 available	AW ('Snipe' × 'Candlepower') 1 W-O An eye-catching trumpet variety, 12cm high with white spiralling perianth and frilly trumpet that matures to a pale peach. Often commented on by visitors. Awarded the Ralph B. White Memorial Medal in 2024	










N64 Narcissus PET LAMB £25 8 available	BD 1 W-W Pet Lamb is an extremely small white trumpet daffodil, flowering at only 5cm high. The creamy white trumpet flowers are less than 2cm in diameter, with a slightly swept-forward perianth, stained bright lime green on the tube. The corona is neatly flanged and frilled at the mouth.	
N65 Narcissus Propeller Group £5 10 available	12 Y-Y (<i>N. bulbocodium</i> subsp. <i>bulbocodium</i> x <i>triandrus</i> subsp. <i>lusitanicus</i>) Striking hybrid from James Akers. 1-2 flowers per 15cm stem with chubby golden corona and twisted perianth.	
N66 Narcissus Pupina pack of 1+3pups £10 8 available	AW (<i>N. rupicola</i> x Candlepower) 2 W-Y Tiny flowers only 2.5cm wide on 18cm stems, this makes probably the most appealing bouquet ever. White perianth and lemon cup, sometimes with extra perianth segments. Scented.	
N67 Narcissus RICOCHET £30 3 available	BD 6 Y-Y (<i>cyclamineus</i> x Camborne) Very rare little cyclamineus hybrid flowering at only 12cm high here. Great upright poise.	
N68 Narcissus RIME pack of 1+pup £20 4 available	The result of crossing a large flowered triandrus with the plant I have labelled <i>N. eualbidus</i> (a very small, upward facing cantabricus type). Flowering at 25cm high, each stem carries 1-3 white flowers with a conical corona and quite long, slightly back-swept perianth. The bulbs have hybrid vigour and increase well.	
N69 Narcissus RUBY MORRIS £20 5 available	An elegant little flower, growing up to 20cm under glass, probably shorter outside. The perianth is a serene creamy white, while the long, frilled corona is a slightly deeper shade when newly open, maturing to match the perianth, but with retaining a zone of acid yellow at the base.	
N70 Narcissus Sedna pack of 1+pup £5 10 available	AW (Moon group) (Atlas Gold OP) 10 Y-Y Selected hoop with upward-facing bright lemon-yellow flowers on short stems. Stamens and especially the style exerted. Free flowering. Increases well.	
N71 Narcissus Sidora £5 6 available	AW (cyclamineus x asturiensis) 6 Y-Y One of my first hybrids, developed because I couldn't buy Minicycla. Awarded a PC. Neat, small flowers on stems to 15cm.	
N72 Narcissus SNIPELET pack of 1+pup £15 20 available	2W-Y. (Candlepower x <i>watieri</i>) New hybrid from Dryad, a smaller and daintier version of Snipe, flowering at about 16cm under glass. White perianth and clear lemon corona.	










N73 Narcissus Speedie pack of 1+pup £20 8 available	BD (<i>N.cyclamineus Select x Gipsy Queen</i>) 6W-Y Fully reflexed little bicolour. 12cm high. Bulks up well.







<p>G6 Galanthus DRYAD DEMETER</p> <p>£150</p> <p>10 available</p>	
<p>DRYAD DEMETER has solid virescent characteristics, more oil paint than watercolour! Demeter is the Greek goddess of agriculture and vegetation (also known as Anesidora, sending gifts up from the earth). In the ancient Greek religion of Hellenismos she is associated with the colour green. I believe this snowdrop redefines the notion of virescent. The outer segments are prettily flanged at the edges, white with a solid emerald green mark reaching almost to the base, and with a notch at the apex. The inner segments are all green with a narrow white rim and narrow sinus.</p> <p>It is a short to mid-height snowdrop growing to about 16cm high under glass, probably shorter in the open. Leaves are short at flowering time, displaying the erect flower stems beautifully. The bulbs increase well.</p>

<p>DRYAD ECHO is named for the beautiful Nymph of the woods and mountains, cursed to repeat the last words she heard. The texture is distinctly ridged, so that the outer mark, a rich green arc, extends along the furrows to produce the 'crown' which is a signature of this variety. There is a small sinus notch.</p> <p>The inner segments feature a green X mark, of which the apical half is deep green, while the basal half is pale and diffuse, whereas the inner surfaces are almost entirely striped with green.</p> <p>The plants increase well, forming large bulbs which flower consistently, and will make an imposing and majestic statement in the garden.</p>

DRYAD LETO

In Greek mythology, Leto was a goddess who caught Zeus's perpetually wandering eye, and conceived twins by him. Knowing that Hera, wife of Zeus, was famously jealous and cruel in her vengence against Zeus's other women, she knew that she had to keep the pregnancy secret, and to find a place hidden from Hera in which to give birth. Her twin children were Apollo and Artemis.

Our Dryad Leto, lovely enough to catch Zeus's attention, also holds a secret – she was deliberately bred to be a prospective mother of yellow inverse poculiforms (ipocs for short), having as her own parents Wendy's Gold and Trym (the ancestor of all ipocs found in gardens). This means that when crossed with any yellow snowdrop, you have a chance of a yellow ipoc in the seedlings. This she has done in our breeding programme, when crossed with Spindleston Surprise, and Dryad Venus, and hopefully some of our other seedlings that have not yet reached flowering size. **UPDATE - LETO is mother of our new DRYAD APOLLO**

We are releasing Dryad Leto straight to our summer list, by-passing ebay, and at a special price, to encourage other growers to try breeding new varieties themselves, and to discover what fun it can be to see those first yellow marks on the outside of a first bud.

Hand pollinate with any yellow in your collection, or, if you trust the bees, plant her out amongst some yellow cultivars and hope they know what they're doing (Really? You trust the bees?)

Beautiful in her own right, Dryad Leto's flowers betray her amorous background with striking, large emerald hearts on both the inner and outer segments, gracefully pendant from stems 25cm high, displaying well above the arching, plicate leaves.

Her snowdrop has long been a favourite here due to the fluid, informal bearing of the flowers, each adopting an individual pose with slightly twisted segments giving the impression of whirling movement, skirts flaring as if they are dancing, even when there is no breeze.

The artistry continues with the outer segment mark which is a painterly 'splash' along the lower third of the midline, stopping short of the up-tilted apical sinus, while the inner segments bear an inverted deep green heart. The flowers are sweetly scented.

The plants are neat and compact, with upright, plicate leaves which are short at flowering time, with the large flowers borne on upright stems reaching to 20cm in height.

In the legend, Terpsichore was thought to be the mother of the Sirens, whose haunting song lured sailors to their doom, but the siren-call of this romantic flower can only lead to delight as the flowers appear to swirl and spin in a silent dance.

DRYAD VENUS has curvaceous, shapely flowers with a flirty frill around the outer segments on mature flowers. The mark on the outer segments is shaped like an inverted heart with an inner segment mark of a deeper green 'X' or kiss. With such a ravishing, sensuous shape and markings the only fitting name was Venus, as the Goddess of Love and Beauty. It is a mid-height snowdrop growing to about 20cm high under glass, probably shorter in the open. To add to all this, not only is it scented, but it probably carries yellow genes having Wendy's Gold and Corrin as parents, so will be useful in breeding programmes for yellow poculiforms.

DRYAD ZEUS has been a nursery favourite since its first flowering, easily spotted amongst all its peers due to its bold streak of deep green running down the centre of the outer segments, leading to it being named after Zeus, the god of the sky and thunder in Greek mythology, well-known for sending down bolts of lightning from the heavens. This snowdrop is equally striking!

Flowering at up to 270mm high (under glass, probably shorter outside), the flowers are held on upright pedicels above arching, plicate leaves which are half the height of the pedicels at flowering time. The mark on each outer segment is a parallel sided, rich green longitudinal stripe covering the central one third of the segment, rounded towards the apex, at which there is a white notch, and fading to paler yellowish green just before reaching the base. The stripe usually has a very slight 'waist' halfway along, occasionally breaking into a double mark.

We will be offering multi-nosed bulbs, which increase well and will soon become an electrifying feature in your collection!

You may have noticed that Zeus has a yellow as a mother, so it is worth pollinating with another yellow to see what you get!

DRYAD BLIZZARD is the inaugural member of the brand new 'Dryad Snow' series of true poculiform snowdrops named for their exceptionally pristine bright white flowers.

The Blizzard lineage started in 2008, when I was generously sent seeds of a poculiform *G. elwesii* from Canada. When they flowered in 2013, none were poculiform, which was unfortunate but not unexpected. The seedlings were intercrossed to produce 6 seeds. These F2 seedlings began to flower in 2017 and to my delight, the result was one perfect poculiform.

After 5 years evaluation, this has proved to be a tall and graceful beauty, growing to 30cm under glass, the leaves only half that height at flowering time. The dazzling, large flowers are in perfect proportion at 40mm long including the ovary, and open into an elegant parasol shape. A clump in flower in your garden will make a glorious and breath-taking focal point.

DRYAD SONATA, slightly favours her pollen parent, Rosemary Burnham, but is more heavily, and variously, marked with green. Flowering at 20cm, the leaves are broad, upright, and slightly twisted, with hooded tips.

The flowers are attractively bell-shaped, constricting into the long claw, with the margins of the distal half of the outer segments distinctively rolled upwards, giving the segment an unusual spear shape, or 'quilled' appearance.

The outer segment mark covers almost the whole of the surface, except for a prominent white spot at the apex, which is common to most of the seedlings from this cross. The deep apple-green colouring is solid at the shoulder and apex, dissolving into lines following the textured furrows in between.

The inner segments, are almost wholly bright emerald, darker over the sinus, and with a paler 'waist' constriction between the two shades.

DRYAD AUTUMN ARISTOCRAT SERIES

In 2013, while enjoying my autumn flowering snowdrops in the greenhouse, I wondered whether the two species I grew – *G. reginae-olgae* and *G. peshmenii* – were fertile if crossed together. On a warm day, when the pollen was running freely from the flowers if tapped, I made the cross between *G. reginae-olgae* 'Cambridge' and my favourite small form of *G. peshmenii*. The ovaries swelled satisfactorily and seeds were duly sown in May of 2014, germinating the following autumn. The first flowers opened in October 2019, and it became clear that we had something very special.

The flowers were of heavy substance, with corrugated outer segments and a nice variation in height and inner markings. The bulbs were healthy and increased over the next two years, often giving more than one scape per bulb. The outstanding feature, though, was the strong, rich, sweet scent common to the seedlings, quite unlike the usual honey scent of the parents.

The leaves were just emerging at the time of flowering, so the flowers were presented well in their pots. Later, as the leaves grew, a complication became apparent: the leaves showed the pale median stripe typical of *G. reginae-olgae*. Had the intended cross actually taken, or were the seedlings pure *G. reginae-olgae*?

Considering the unusual texture of the flowers and the distinctive perfume, as well as the vigour of the seedlings, I feel confident of their hybridity.

DRYAD COUNTESS

COUNTESS is the middle sister, slightly shorter than **PRINCESS**, at 13cm in flower, and with leaves barely emerging at flowering time. The spathe is slightly shorter than the pedicel, and the ovary slightly more egg-shaped than spherical. The outer segments are slightly shorter at 20mm, and not so deeply ribbed. The inner segments are slightly narrower at 10mm long by 9mm wide, while the inner mark is usually two small triangular dots either side of the inverted V-shaped sinus, occasionally joined by a faint, narrow bridge, and a white margin. **COUNTESS** has the same strong sweet scent and vigour characteristic of the group.

DRYAD DUCHESS


Flowering at 12cm high, **DUCHESS** is slightly shorter than **COUNTESS**, with leaves just emerging at flowering time. Though smaller in stature, **DUCHESS** has the largest flowers of the group. The spathe is quite straight, and longer than the pedicel, while the ovary is egg-shaped. The outer segments are 26mm long, with a 4mm long 'claw', deeply cupped and longitudinally ribbed, especially in the basal half. The inner segments are 12mm long by 10mm, and wide bear the largest mark of the group, a rich emerald green, fading slightly towards the base with the green running along the corrugations to 60% of the length of the segment. Again, the mark has a crisp white margin around the narrow sinus. **DRYAD DUCHESS** was awarded a Preliminary Certificate by the Joint Rock Committee in 2023.

DRYAD PRINCESS Flowering at 18cm high, PRINCESS is the tallest of the group so far. The flowers stand clearly on strong stems above the just-emerging leaves. The flowers are attractively rounded, the outer segments joined to the small spherical ovary by a short 'claw'. The spathe is quite short and curved, approximately twice as long as the pedicel. The outer segments are 22mm long, deeply cupped and strongly longitudinally ribbed. The inner segments are 11mm long x 10mm wide, with an apple-green mark covering the apical third, except for a crisp, white margin. The sinus is an inverted V shape. They are also markedly longitudinally ribbed. The scent is outstanding, sweet and rich, not honey-like. The bulbs are healthy and vigorous, increasing well. DRYAD PRINCESS was awarded a Preliminary Certificate by the Joint Rock Committee in 2023	

G19 Galanthus Estonian Bird Double Kaur (Artic Loon) £20 5 available	A fine double snowdrop flowering at about 13cm high. The flowers usually have 3 unmarked outers and a neat whorl of inner segments which have an inverted heart mark at the apex and occasionally a fainter mark at the base. Between the outers and the inner whorl, there is usually an additional set of 3 segments that are intermediate in shape and colouring to the others. Taavi thinks that this makes it a double poculiform. The leaves are about half the height of the flowering stems at flowering time. The bulbs are vigorous and increase well.	
G20 Galanthus Estonian Bird Double Lagle (Barnacle Goose) £25 double-nosed bulb 6 available	A fine double snowdrop flowering at about 16cm high with usually very regular flowers with 3 outers and a neat whorl of inner segments which have a double mark, the two marks often joined together. The leaves are upright and about half the height of the flowering stems at flowering time.	

GALANTHUS ALPHABETICAL LIST

ESTONIAN BIRD DOUBLE SNOWDROPS These new double varieties have the stamp of that great plantsman Taavi Tuulik who bred and developed the range in Estonia, along with the excellent Estonian Spirit range grown and introduced by Dryad Nursery. Taavi chose to name the series after Estonian birds. There are varieties with wonderful inner markings, quite distinct amongst the doubles and those with elongated inner petals like Berthille, which give them a petticoat appearance. We are proud to be able to release some of these stunning new varieties making a major addition to the double snowdrop varieties available to discerning collectors. Taavi's own notes on the group: <i>Galanthus Estonian Birds Group is created by Taavi Tuulik from händ pollinated seeds using Galanthus nivalis 'Flore Pleno' as a male parent. The crossings were made in open garden 2007-2008 and were not fully controlled. Female parents were:</i> <i>G. plicatus from Crimea ('Kaur', 'Sõtkas', 'Vart')</i> <i>G. plicatus from Krasnodar region, Russia (with all-green inner segments) ('Kakk', 'Meltsas')</i> <i>G. elwesii var. elwesii from Turkey (Dutch export) ('Tihane', 'Tikk')</i> <i>G. elwesii var. elwesii from abandoned garden in Hiiumaa, must come from the NW Black Sea coast ('Lagle', 'Ristpart', 'Tutkas')</i> <i>Mixed plants G. elwesii and G. elwesii x nivalis – from abandoned garden in Hiiumaa, G. elwesii must come from the NW Black Sea coast ('Aul', 'Kiur', 'Luik', 'Sabatihane', 'Siisike', 'Vutt')</i> <i>From ca 200 bulbs during their first flowering 2012-2015 16 were with double flowers.</i>

G18 Galanthus Estonian Bird Double Aul (Long-tailed Duck) £25 double-nosed bulb 4 available	AUL is a very pretty and distinctive double snowdrop flowering at 10-12 cm, with narrow leaves, and 3 outer segments surrounding a boss of inner segments which bear a two-toned double mark. The apical inverted V is a dark green, whereas the second mark, about half-way along the segment, is a more diffuse oval of pale apple green, sometimes separating into two 'eyes'. The 3 central inner segments are sometimes all white, extending beyond the rest of the inners. It increases well.

G21 Galanthus KERA £30 8 available	One of the features I always like in snowdrop flowers is the lovely crinkly texture of the outers on, for instance, Diggory. A new variety, G. plicatus Kera, has deeply corrugated flowers in a wonderful balloon shape. It is shorter than Diggory. It is a seedling sent to me from Estonia, and was bred by Taavi Tuulik from the cultivar 'Suur Tilk', which itself was bred by Sulev Savisaar.

G23 Galanthus reginae-olgae Anmarie Kee £15 double-nosed bulb 5 available	Usually green-tipped selection of this autumn-flowering species from America. Doesn't always display the green marks, but these bulbs have all been green at some point!	
G24 Galanthus reginae-olgae Blanc de Chine £50 3 available	This superb autumn-flowering cultivar is an albino form with no green markings on the inner segments. Very rare and highly sought-after.	
G25 Galanthus reginae-olgae Ruby's Green Dream £40 double-nosed bulb 10 available	This superb autumn-flowering cultivar is a rare green-marked form, with green lines converging to shade across the centre of the outer segments.
